The Roman Empire

- I. Governing the empire
 - A. Boundaries and territory
 - 1. Roman Empire stretched from Britain to Egypt
 - 2. Rome controlled all the lands around the Mediterranean
 - B. Augustus
 - 1. Intelligent ruler who showed respect for the senate
 - 2. People gave Augustus as much power as he wanted
 - C. Governing conquered peoples
 - 1. Divided the empire into provinces, each with its own Roman governor supported by an army
 - 2. Romans did not force their way of life on conquered peoples; Rome wanted provinces that would supply raw materials; buy Roman goods, pay taxes, adopt Roman ways
 - D. The emperors
 - 1. Worst Roman emperors were Caligula and Nero
 - 2. Hadrian was the greatest of five "good emperors" standardized laws throughout the empire, reorganized the army, and encouraged learning
 - 3. Last of the "good emperors" was Marcus Aurelius, who chose son Commodus to follow him
- II. Greek influence on Rome
 - A. Romans adopted Greek religion and heroes
 - B. Romans used Greek ideas to build things
- III. Architecture and technology
 - A. The Roman style
 - 1. Romans copied Greek sculpture and architecture
 - 2. Romans built larger structures using arches; also used concrete to build taller buildings
 - B. Roads and aqueducts
 - 1. Roman roads covered huge distances
 - 2. Some Roman aqueducts still used today
- IV. Roman law
 - A. Cicero, Justinian
 - 1. Believed in the indestructible nature of law
 - 2. Many Roman ideas of justice are basic to our system of laws today
